Two veterans (that we are aware of) in Kerford Clinic, Open Arms (Andrea) contacted to manage the mental health legislation re veteran's involuntary status being revoked to voluntary.



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Three volunteers attended the full day volunteers workshop.

DVA refusal of veteran white card reviewed and denied.

Veterans lawns to be serviced for 3 months while rehabilitating, will review situation when time expires. Veteran white card application completed.

Lift has been 'Out of Order' for over a week. Have placed a sign informing veterans and family to phone if they are unable to access stairs.

Investigating TAFE 'Towing Course' for current and ex-service personnel.

TPI veteran has to annually reapply for RCOW concessions. This only occurs to approx 6 out of 160 local veterans. DVA sees this as a council issue and vice versa, all to do with the data portal.

Have set up a spreadsheet to monitor attendance at the Veteran morning tea. Having held the 5th coffee catch up the statistics identifies the following: 47 ex-service personnel have attended at least once (43 Males 4 Females) of this number 15 have chosen to bring their partner and average attendance to date is 26 veteran/partner.

A questionnaire shared at the morning tea identified the majority would prefer not to have a guest speaker, would like to see more outings and would like the opportunity to bring along an article of memorabilia/interest to share in the future.

Open Arms (Terri) has accepted an invitation to attend the July coffee morning. The request was initiated by a younger veteran.

Free coffee morning advert has been appearing in The Chronicle 'Social Calendar'- intend to submit monthly. Would also like to place information re Veteran Support hours of business in Social Calendar. Referral to 'Workcom' re veteran's vocational rehabilitation was accepted and activated.

Notification of increased prices for gutter cleaning.

Sent Legacy Melbourne supporting information re Veterans DVA compensation claim.

Goorambat luncheon and silo art excursion was attended by 9 people (4 veterans, 2 wives, 3 WSO.) During lunch we caught up with Eugene and Bette from the Benalla RSL.
